About: The Riding Centre occupies 60 acres of land that is part of the 1,000-acre Glen Helen Nature Preserve owned by the Glen Helen Association. Through the generosity of the Yellow Springs community, and countless volunteers, the Riding Centre has been able to offer lessons, therapeutic riding and day camps to the Miami Valley at affordable cost for over 40 years. Facilities include two barns, rolling pastures, a large outdoor ring, a lighted indoor ring, a cross-country hunt course, several wooded trails and stables.

About: Story Chain makes connections between the reader and the listener through community outreach, literacy interventions and audio technology. Using the knowledge of social and restorative justice and family literacy, trained volunteers produce audio files from incarcerated parents and parents of children with disabilities of families of seniors living in assisted care facilities. The recordings are then edited and downloaded on an MP3 player for the clients (listener) to receive.
