Food Security

The 2024 YSCF Youth Action Board's area of focus is to provide better access to nutritious food. The Youth Action Board believes that access to healthy nutritious food is a basic and necessary human need that should not be restricted by one's socioeconomic status, age, race, identity, mobility, or any other possible discriminating factor. Young people in the community struggle to find fresh nutritious and affordable food consistently at school, in town, and in their homes. The YAB believes continued support for food security can increase our youth's capacity to thrive physically, intellectually, and emotionally into adulthood.

Yellow Springs Community Kitchen

The board decided to award this year's funds toward the repair, restoration and reorganization of a centrally located community kitchen. The kitchen identified is at the First Presbyterian Church of Yellow Springs. "The need for a community soup kitchen has been discussed, requested, and researched. We kept coming back to the kitchen at the First Presbyterian Church due to its central location, the state-of-the-art equipment, kitchen layout, and the Foundation and Presbyterian's shared mission in support of our community," said Jeannamarie Cox, Executive Director of YSCF. "We are lucky to have such a wonderful asset already in our community, we need to bring it back online."

100% of participants said YAB improved their ability to identify an issue and take action.

Students raised awareness and funding (\$7,725) for better access to nutritoius food for youth.



LEADERSHIP

Because of YAB, 100% of participants said they would be more likely to take on a leadership role.



KNOWLEDGE

100% of participants gained knowledge of their local nonprofits and how they work.



LIFE SKILLS

Participants showed improvement in non-cognitive skills 98% of the time.
